Notes obtained from the Sierra County Geneological Society - Marilyn Poitras, Margaret Vetter's notes and current research

- 1 The grave is between two large trees and marked only with a rock mound, name unknown.
- 2

"Armer" on east side "Reid" on west side. Large grey marble with flowers carved on edge. Collective marker of family plot.

- 3 Died of concussion from a fall. Brother of Edith Pankey?? Third child of Margaret Reid and Edward Armer.
- 4 Mining engineer of Louisville, KY & son of a paddle wheel steamboat captain, came to Kingston as a result of the silver boom. Near Margaret Reid Armer.

- ⁶ "Mother." Margaret became very well-known nationally fo the Angora oats she raised. Married Simpson Percy Reid in 1879 at age 16. They moved to Kingston during the Silver boom. He died of typhoid fever in 1892 epidemic in Kingston leaving Margaret with 6 young children. Married Edward Armer and had 3 more children. He died in 1902.

- 15 Wife of Samuel they lived in Kingston for many years. Part of their home is one of the last still standing on the west end south side of the road in Kingston. They're two graves along with that of their daughter Lily Bell Brownell, are enclosed by a white picket fence. Black marble stone.
- 16 Husband of Amelia. He was a miner, Republican precinct chairman, and one of the leaders of the well-known Spit and Whittle club. Inside picket fence, grey marble marker. Headstone had remains of trellis covering it.

Acquired a house in 1908 on east end of Kingston. Still there today.

- 62 Grave with Scandinavian-style wooden coss. Rand died in mountains hiking. Remains found following spring.
- 63 Marble marker no date. Civil War enclosure. Served in Louisiana Company C First Infantry.

- 66 Pine slab which formerly marked the grave is now missing. The site is near the south entrance at the fence. Miner in early 1800's. Sheba was characterized in Mark Twain's Roughing It. Find-a-Grave has copy of his death certificate.

Became a US citizen at Socorro in 1875 and woked as a mason. Fought in an indian uprising and later took on work as a Siera County Clerk.

Congressional Medal of Honor recipient. Served in 3rd and eighth Calvary fom 1858-1883. Wounded duing the Civil War battle of Valverde, NMon Febuary 21 1862. After discharge lived in Hatch, Hillsboro and Kingston where he worked mining claims. He died in Kingston on November 26, 1904. Location of grave is debated, but he lived in Kingston until he died.
